

# Flameworking Community Exhibit

## Open to all International Flameworking Conference attendees

Due to the popularity of the previous years' exhibits, Salem Community College invites conference attendees to show their glass work on March 29 and 30. Carefully read the following guidelines. - Due to space limitations, Salem Community College (SCC) can only accept one piece or one grouping of small work per attendee.
- Work (single object or total grouping) may not exceed 30 lbs. and 20" in any direction.
- All work must be free-standing.
- SCC will not accept liability if work is damaged, lost, stolen or left at the conference. Insurance coverage is the sole responsibility of the artist.
- Work may be dropped off or picked up during designated times **ONLY (NO EXCEPTIONS)**:
  - Exhibitors must drop off their work in the **new exhibit area, the DuPont Field House, between 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Saturday, March 29** until space is filled. Due to space limitations in SCC's receiving area, **pieces cannot be shipped to SCC in advance.**
  - Exhibitors must pick up their work between 12:30 p.m. and 2:30 p.m. on Sunday, March 30.
  - No late drop-offs or early pick-ups will be permitted.
  - NOTE: Any work that remains after 2:30 p.m. Sunday becomes the property of SCC.
- Work will be exhibited from 12 noon to 3:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 29 and from 9 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. on Sunday, March 30. SCC will staff the exhibit area during exhibition hours. The Field House will be secured at all other times.
- At the time of work drop-off, each exhibiting artist must complete a form with his/her contact information, the work's title and a notation of whether or not the object is for sale. Each exhibitor must sign the form, to indicate that he/she understands that SCC will not be held liable for damaged, lost or stolen work and that any work that remains after 2:30 p.m. Sunday will become the property of SCC.
- Sales are to be conducted strictly between the buyer and seller. No commissions will be taken. However, it is suggested that sellers voluntarily donate 20 percent of their proceeds to the Salem Community College Foundation, to be earmarked to help fund future International Flameworking Conference exhibits.
- SCC reserves the right to deny the showing of work.
