The Emergency Management option provides students with an extensive background in all-hazards emergency management. Students learn the fundamental concepts of the Incident Command System (ICS). Students also learn about the emergency planning process and develop the skills to safely conduct an emergency management exercise. The program prepares students for careers as emergency managers in local government, police, fire, emergency medical services and industry.

Upon successfully completing this program, students should be able to:

- ▼ communicate effectively in a professional manner,
- ▼ demonstrate a fundamental knowledge of the emergency planning process,
- ▼ successfully develop and conduct emergency management exercises,
- ▼ demonstrate a working knowledge of the Incident Command System (ICS), and
- ▼ apply the principles of all hazards emergency management to effectively address an emergency situation.
